The Polish Heritage Society working with other organisations undertakes to restore the graves of historic émigré figures within the Polish community

Polish Vice Admiral Jerzy Swirski was an officer in the Russian Navy and Polish Navy. He served in the Black Sea Fleet until the end of World War I. In 1919 he joined the Polish Navy. From 1925 to 1947 he was Commander of the Polish Navy in the Polish Ministry of Military Affairs.

Early in 1940 Polish Naval Command transferred from Paris to London, under the Command of Rear Admiral Swirski, in the Polish Government in Exile. After World War II he remained in the United Kingdom. He died in 1959 and was buried in Brompton cemetery, London.

General Sergiusz Zahorski was a General of Cavalry and also of the Polish Army and Head of the President of Poland's War Office during WWII. He died in London in 1962.

Both the Rear Admiral Swirski and General Zahorski are buried in the same plot, together with their respective wives. The Polish Heritage Society in partnership with The Embassy of the Republic of Poland, undertook to renovate this grave.

All Saints' Day

The Polish Heritage Society, along with many other organisations visited cemeteries in Ealing, Brompton, Kensal Rise, Hampstead, North Sheen, and Putney Vale.

The British Premiere of the Choral Concert of the recently discovered Mass in F by Prince Joseph Poniatowski was held at Westminster Cathedral Hall. A joint venture with the Polish Knights of Malta UK and a resounding success

Back in 2013 the grave of **Prince Joseph Poniatowski** was found in Kent and fully restored by the Polish Heritage Society, this was followed by a concert in March 2014 of his opera arias at The Polish Embassy, to great acclaim. Subsequent research into the history of Prince Joseph Poniatowski led to the discovery of his Mass in F, written in the Bel Canto style and dedicated to His Majesty Don Louis I, King of Portugal.

The Polish Heritage Society (PHS) in conjunction with the Association of the Polish Knights of Malta (UK) decided to help bring this historic composition to London in 2015. Music scores were found in the British Library, two UK based Polish Choirs, one choir from Katowice, four soloists from Poland, Portugal, Italy and UK, an artistic director, a conductor, a top pianist accompanist had to be located. Each choir and soloist had to rehearse for 9 months prior to coming to London, where joint rehearsals were held. The concert, the venue, the ticket sales, the programme production and advertising were all managed by PHS.

Benefactors and the Honorary Committee were jointly co-ordinated by the two organizations with the outstanding support of many communities in Poland, France and the UK. There were three performances, the first a sung performance at Our Lady of Czestochowa and Saint Casimir Church, Islington. The Gala premiere was held at Westminster Cathedral Hall on 27th June and a full sung mass of the composition in Christ The King Church in Balham on 28th June. It is estimated that over 1,000 people attended the performance, raising over £3,000 for charity. The concert was a sell out!

Shell shock WWII victims buried at Horton Cemetery







In February 2015 a memorial service was held for the Polish residents who suffered shell shock and other nervous trauma during WWII and resided at the Long Grove Hospital and the St Ebbas Hospital in Epsom, Surrey

Frequently these residents had no family in the UK and on their demise were buried in the hospital cemetery.

PHS has located 49 Polish names, who were mainly soldiers and died between 1948 – 1954.

There were more but records cannot be found although research is being carried out to trace more soldiers who were placed in the Hospital.

The cemetery's original capacity was 900 but around 9,000 were buried there.

When the hospitals were closed, the cemetery land was sold to a developer, but planning permission for its development was refused by the Council.

The matter came to light earlier when young boys found human bones in the area, probably dug up by roaming dogs. Epsom Council and in particular Mrs Carlson decided to take the matter up and work towards cleaning up the area and working towards protecting the area and the memorial. The Polish Heritage Society is actively supporting this initiative.

A ceremony to remember the Polish Soldiers who lay buried at the cemetery was held on 10th February 2015, attended by the ex-Mayor Epsom Cllr. Alan Carlson, Cllr. Sheila Carlson, "Friends of Horton Cemetery", Local Press, Local Rep from The British Legion, PHS Chairman and two PHS representatives, Maj.Marek Zaremba Tymieniecki, Mr. Janusz Kolendo, Canon Wladyslaw Wyszowadzki, Vice Consul Ireneusz Truszkowski, Vice Consul Ines Czajczynska-Da Costa,
