The IPMH lecture: Professor Norman Davies discusses Mieszko to NATO: Military Alliances in Polish History



Norman Davies CMG FBA FRHistS is a Welsh-Polish historian known for his many publications on the history of Europe, Poland and the United Kingdom. Davies intended to study for a PhD in the Soviet Union but was denied an entry visa, so instead he went to Kraków, Poland, to study at the Jagiellonian University and conduct research on the Polish-Soviet War. Since this war did not officially exist in communist Poland, he was obliged to change the title of his dissertation to British Foreign Policy towards Poland, 1919-20. After he obtained his PhD in Kraków in 1968, the English text was published in 1972 under the title White Eagle, Red Star. The Polish-Soviet War 1919-20. From 1971, Davies taught Polish history at the School of Slavonic and East European Studies of University College London, where he was professor from 1985 to 1996, when he retired.

# The IPMH lecture: Professor Dr Andrzej Nowak discusses Poland's Security Dilemmas up to 1800



Andrzei Nowak is a Polish historian and opinion journalist. He was born in November 1960 in Kraków, Poland. He is a professor at The Jagiellonian University and at the Institute of History of the Polish Academy of Sciences in Warsaw, where he is head of the Section for the History of Eastern Europe and the Empires of the 19th and 20th Centuries. In 1996 he was a visiting professor at Rice University in Houston, Texas. He was the co-founder and for many years (1994–2012) editor-in-chief of the prestigious conservative cultural-political magazine Arcana. He contributes to the monthly Wpis on a regular basis and is one of the main authors of the publishing house Biały Kruk. Andrzej Nowak has published extensively and written over 40 books. He has also produced a great many reviews and interviews.

#### The IPMH lecture: Major General David Tadeusz Ząbecki discusses Generals Kościuszko and Pułaski



General Ząbecki enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1966 and served in Vietnam as an infantry rifleman. As a lieutenant colonel in May 1995, he was sent to Poland as the chief of one of NATO's Partnership for Peace Traveling Contact Teams to conduct discussions with the Polish General Staff about the interoperability requirements for NATO membership. He holds a doctorate in Military History from the Royal Military College of Science, Cranfield University (UK) where his supervisor was the late Professor Richard Holmes. In 2012 he held the Dr. Leo A. Shiffrin Distinguished Chair of Military History at the U.S. Naval Academy, Annapolis.

Mieczysław B. Biskupski received his doctorate from Yale University and holds the Blejwas Endowed Chair in Polish History at Central Connecticut State University. He has been President of both the Polish Institute of Arts and Sciences and the Polish American Historical Association in the United States as well as being a Director of the Józef Piłsudski Institute in New York. He has published eighteen books and more than sixty essays and has conducted research throughout Europe and North America in sixteen languages.

#### The IPMH lecture: Count Adam Zamoyski discusses **Poland's Armies during the time of Napoleon**



Although born in New York, in 1949, Adam Zamoyski was brought up in England and spent much of his youth in other European countries. He was educated at Downside School and read History and Modern Languages at The Queen's College, Oxford. He speaks French, Italian, Russian and Polish. Zamoyski's family originates from Poland. His parents left the country when it was invaded by Germany and Russia in 1939, and were stranded in exile when the Soviets took it over at the end of World War II. Drawn to it as much by the historical processes at work there as by family ties, Zamoyski began to visit Poland in the late 1960s. His interest in the subject is combined with a feel for its connections to the history and culture of other nations, and a deep understanding of the pan-European context.

Dr Paul Latawski, is a Senior Lecturer in the War Studies Department, Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst. His interest area covers Central and Eastern Europe. Current research interests include the Polish Armed Forces in the West during WWII, Polish resistance to occupation 1939-45, urban operations. He is writing a history of 1<sup>st</sup> Polish Armoured Division's operations in Normandy. Dr Latawski has been a long-standing lecturer on both PHS UK and IPMH UK programmes and an ardent supporter of ours for many years.


#### The IPMH lecture: Professor Antony Polonsky discusses *Poland's Politics 1914-1939*



Antony Polonsky, Professor Emeritus of Holocaust Studies at Brandeis University was a Rhodes Scholar in modern history. His doctoral thesis was a study of Józef Pilsudski's relationship with parliament entitled: *Politics in Independent Poland 1921-1939. The Crisis of Constitutional Government.* Antony Polonsky was born in Johannesburg, South Africa to Lithuanian Jewish immigrant parents who arrived in South Africa in the late 19th century. His father was from a Yiddish-speaking family from near Grodno (in modern day Belarus) and his mother was from a Jewish family from Lithuania. Polonsky was not raised in a Polish speaking background, and he has compared his childhood, growing up in South Africa, to the movie *The Help*, being brought up by African servants who had no political rights. As a student at the University of the Witwatersrand, Polonsky organised non-violent demonstrations against apartheid policies.

#### The IPMH lecture: Dr Dermot Turing discusses Poland's cipher security in WWII - 1: An overview



Sir John Dermot Turing, 12th Baronet, born in 1961 is a British solicitor and author. Dermot Turing was educated at Sherborne School and King's College, Cambridge. He then undertook a DPhil degree in genetics at New College, Oxford, before moving into the legal profession. He first worked in the Department of the HM Treasury as a solicitor. He then worked at the international law firm Clifford Chance, where he was a partner until 2014 and latterly a consultant. Turing is the nephew of Alan Turing (1912-1954). In 2012, the centenary year of Alan Turing's birth, Dermot Turing became a trustee of Bletchley Park, where Alan Turing worked as a cryptologist during World War II. In 2015 he wrote a book on Alan Turing, Prof: Alan Turing Decoded, and in 2017 he contributed a chapter to The Turing Guide.

#### The IPMH lecture: Mr Roger Moorhouse discusses Poland in WWII



Roger Moorhouse has an MA in history and politics from the University of London. His book 'Berlin at War' was listed among the books of the year for 2010. First to Fight: The Polish War 1939 is his most recent publication and focuses on the German and Soviet invasion of Poland in September 1939. Shortlisted for the Duke of Wellington Medal for Military History 2020. In 2014, Moorehouse's The Devils' Alliance: Hitler's Pact with Stalin, 1939-1941 was published. Despite praising the book for its "masterly" account of the signing of the Molotov-Ribbentrop Pact, the historian Richard J. Evans took issue with the book's treatment of the crimes of the Soviets over those of the Nazis. Other reviewers of the book were more positive: the Wall Street Journal described it as "superb".



















#### The IPMH lecture: Dr Franciszek Rozwadowski discusses Poland's cipher security in WWII - 2: Polish intelligence traffic



Born in South Africa, Franciszek Jordan-Rozwadowski grew up in Swaziland and is now based in the United States. He studied at Brandeis and went on to earn a doctorate, in economics, at Columbia University. He taught economics at Wesleyan University during 1982-1989 then spent 25 years on the staff of the International Monetary Fund. He is now engaged in research on the contest between Polish and German intelligence during the Second World War. On the Polish side his research focuses on Ekspozytura F/F2, one of the largest allied intelligence operations in occupied France. His interest in F2 began with a family connection - his father was its chief of intelligence - but broadened to encompass the network's structure and tradecraft. On the German side his research focuses on the Wehrmacht's cipher department (OKW/Chi), and its attack on Polish radio traffic, including that of F2.

Dr. Halik Kochanski was born in 1962 and she is a British historian and writer. She was educated at Downside School and at Balliol College, Oxford, where she was awarded an M.A. in Modern History. She obtained her Ph.D from King's College, London. She has taught history at King's College London and University College, London. She has published a number of historical articles and two books: Sir Garnet Wolseley: Victorian Hero in 1999 and The Eagle Unbowed: Poland and the Poles in the Second World War in 2012. She is a Fellow of the Royal Historical Society, and a member of the Army Records Society, the Society for Army Historical Research, the British Commission for Military History and the Institute for Historical Research. As of 2012 she is a judge for the Templer Medal book prize.

# Who We Are



- The Polish Heritage Society (UK), PHS(UK), was formed to promote greater awareness of the historical links between Poland and the UK among present and future generations of citizens.
- Incorporated as a limited liability company on 04 February 2011 (Registered Number 07517923, England and Wales) and registered as a charity by the Charity Commission (Registered Number 1143791) on 13 September 2011.









LONDON, 25th June, 2021 – A plaque commemorating Polish World War II hero General Władysław Anders was unveiled on Friday 25th June 2021 on his London home, where Prime Minister Winston Churchill visited him after the war. The inscription on the plaque, an initiative of the Polish Heritage Society (UK) and the Polish Embassy in the United Kingdom, records his extraordinary achievement of leading 120,000 Poles in an arduous journey from the Soviet Russia to freedom in 1942, as the head of what became later known as "Anders' Army". It also marks his role as commander of the 2nd Polish Corps, notably at the Battle of Monte Cassino in Italy in 1944.
