Polish Heritage Society UK was set up 12 years ago in 2011 as a registered British Charity **by a group of people who were on the committee for the build of the Polish Allied Armed Forces Monument** in THE NATIONAL MEMORIAL ARBORETUM in Alrewas in 2008/2009. Some of these people were interested in promoting Poland and its History and Heritage. From an initial meeting grew the idea of Polish Heritage Society UK.

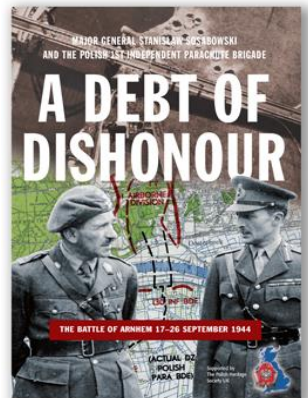
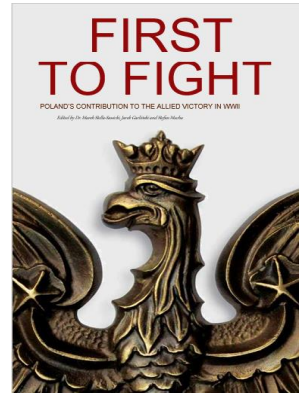

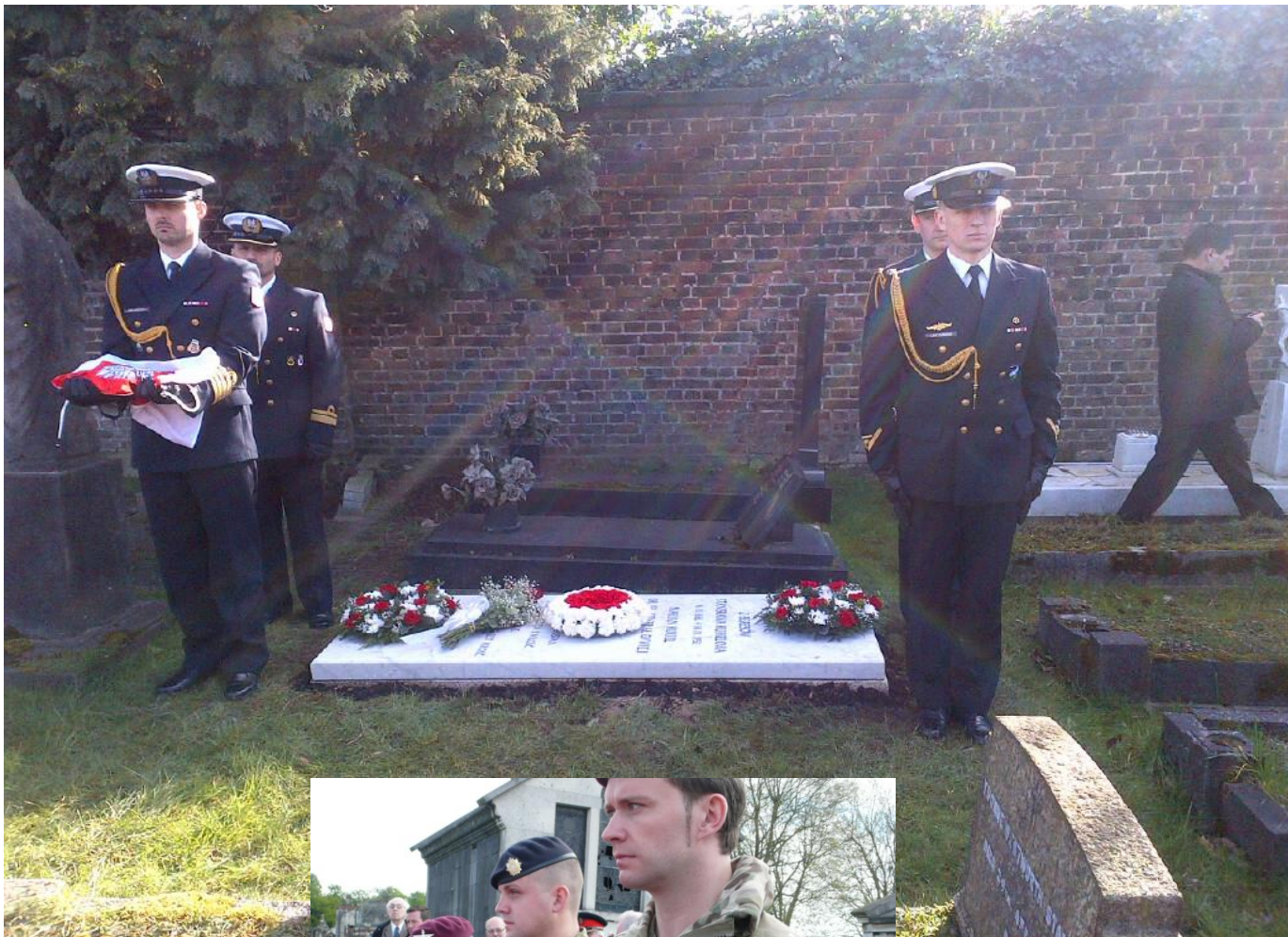
General Marian Kukiel - World War II General and Military Historian.

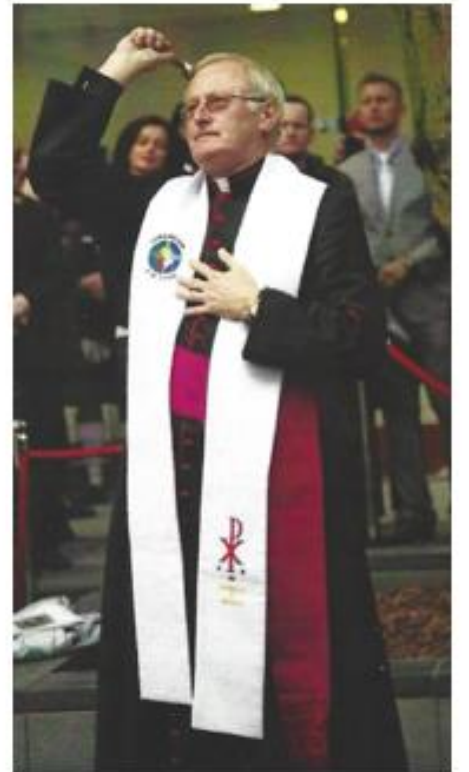
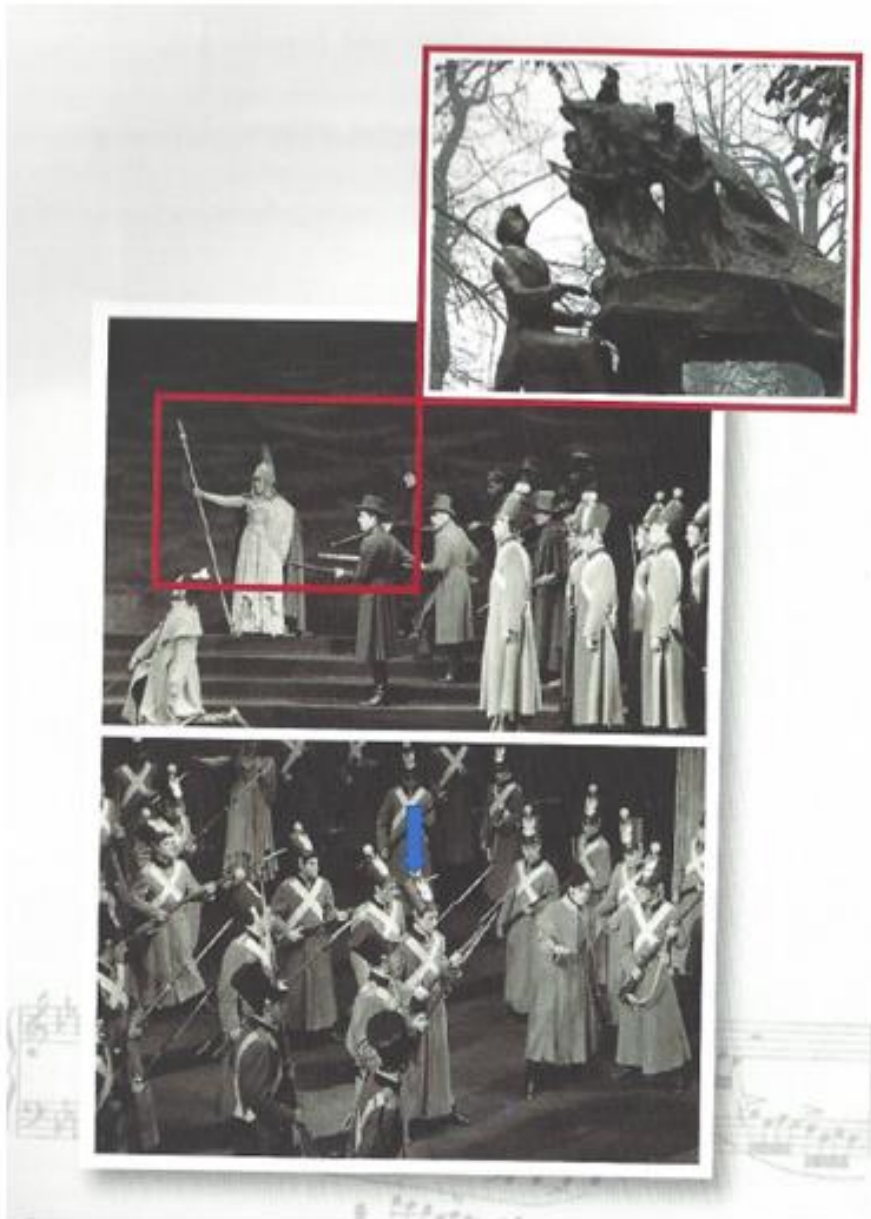

Chopin Statue Renovation - South Bank. Following a **40 year disappearance** of Chopin's statue by Bronislaw Kubica, winner of a Polish National Competition for a statue to gift to the people of the UK as a '*thank you*' for their help in WWII. It was unveiled in 1974 by Princess Alice, Duchess of Gloucester. **The statue disappeared.** PHS UK eventually tracked it down thanks to the **Freedom of Information Act 2000** and direct help from the homeless people of the Southbank in 2011. The statue was found in a derelict condition, with no plinth. PHS paid for its renovation in Poznan, a new plinth was organised, transportation there and back to the UK followed by installation and re-unveiling by HRH Duke of Gloucester. **Currently 2 theatres in Worcester and Cirencester** are working with us on the **"Rescuing Chopin"** play for its **Premiere on 27th January 2024.** A play in 2 acts.

Memorial to Chopin at Festival Hall

A MEMORIAL to Chopin, which provides lessons for all those concerned with the art of sculpture, with its siting in public places and indeed with town planning, was yesterday unveiled by Princess Alice, Duchess of Gloucester.

The memorial, which is on the South Bank outside the entrance of the Royal Festival Hall facing the Hayward Gallery is by a young Polish sculptor Marian Kubica.

He has produced a large abstract bronze perfectly suited to its site. The commission, the result of a competition held in Poland, judged among others by the Duke of St Albans and Sir Thomas Monington, the President of the Royal Academy, has obviously gone to the right man.

The problems involved were difficult for the uncompromising, de-humanised architecture of the Royal Festival Hall, the Hayward Gallery and the surrounding buildings and the have made any purely representational piece of sculpture look out of place. Kubica has arrived at a suitable compromise.

Austerity in tune

His bronze is perfectly adjusted to its setting. Its austerity is in tune with the sufficient references to direct human connotations to evoke an immediate response.

Viewed from most angles, the memorial appears as an abstract upright bronze shape echoing both nature and architecture. The relationship with both has, indeed, been carefully contrived.

Not only does the memorial provide an admirable foil to the surrounding buildings but it is also carefully adjusted to its immediate setting. It stands on an island of gently sloping grass, backed by two splendid trees.

Yet it is not just a matter of de-humanised consideration. Viewed from the front there emerges from the bronze a clearly recognisable head of the composer whose music has, over the years, meant so much to millions.

Earth from Poland

Nearby, in the Festival Hall itself, there is something else linking Poland and Britain. Here there is a casket, itself an admirable example of contemporary craftsmanship, containing earth from Chopin's birthplace at Zelazow Wola, in Poland.

That the commission for a memorial to Chopin, close to the heart of musical life in London, should have been so successfully resolved, is particularly satisfactory. It was initiated in 1969 by the late Prof Stefan Niekraus, and much planning and thought has been involved.

The final result will long serve as an example as to how the difficult problem of relating sculpture to an uncompromisingly contemporary setting can be solved.

Search ends on a high note

Like a set of car keys or your favourite Biro, a two-tonne bronze statue of Chopin is a very easy thing to mislay.

Now, 25 years after it mysteriously vanished from the storage vaults of the Royal Festival Hall in London, it has turned up and will be unveiled for a second time tomorrow.

Presented to Britain as a gift from the Polish people in recognition of British help in liberating Poland during the Second World War, the two-metre high

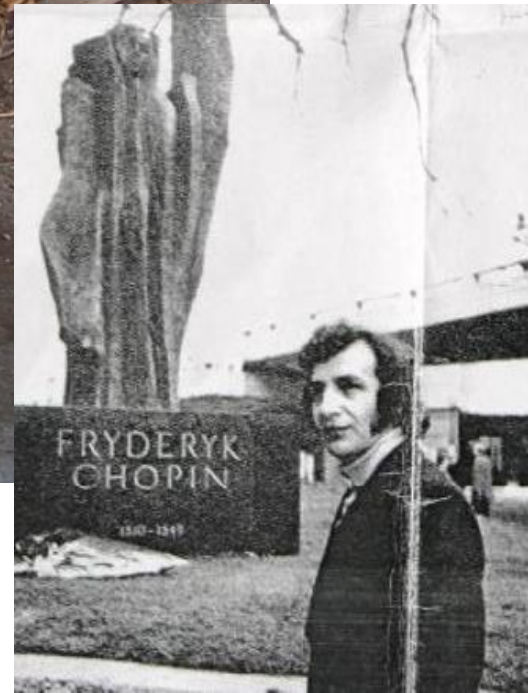
brutalist sculpture of the Polish composer Frédéric Chopin, created by Bronisław Kubica, was unveiled outside the Royal Festival Hall in 1975 by Princess Alice, Duchess of Gloucester. There it stood for almost ten years until it was removed and placed in storage during renovation work to the Southbank. It was not to be seen again... until now.

"It was moved from place to place while in storage and was forgotten about," says Dr Marek Stella-Sawicki, chairman of the Polish Heritage Society. "There were many of us looking for it, including the Polish Embassy, Lady Cholmondeley from the Chopin Society, a consultant for English Heritage—there must have been 50 or 60 people searching for it."

Dr Stella-Sawicki tried tracking down people who had worked on the renovation of the Royal Festival Hall in

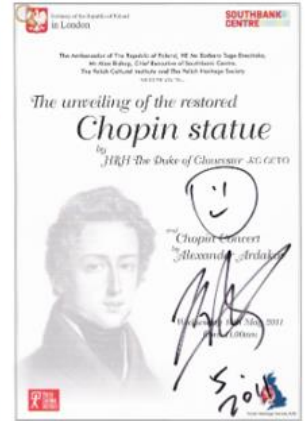

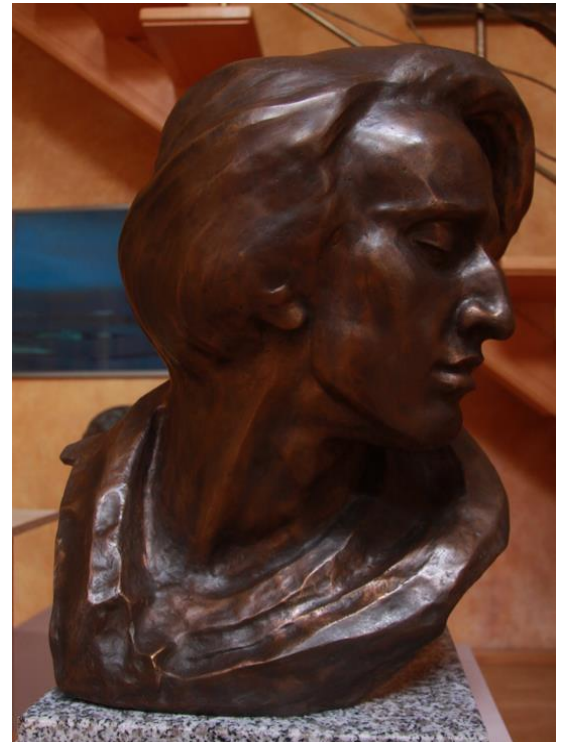

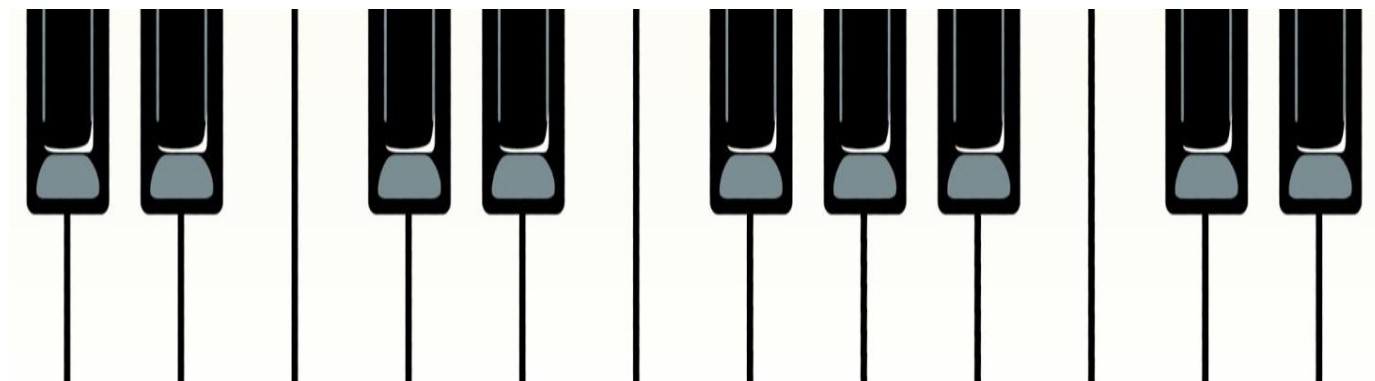

His film scores have won many honours including the best score award for the music to *Ziemia Obiecana / The Promised Land* in 1975 also *The Pianist* in 2002, directed by Roman Polanski. He received an award from the Cork International Film Festival for the music to *From A Far Country* (1981) about the life of Pope John Paul II. 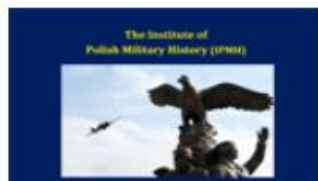
