

1. The Odysseyski: One Man's War: A Nation's Fate

Michael Moszynski worked for the Saatchi Brothers for 20 years all over the world and in 2008 founded his own global agency, LONDON Advertising. Michael was born in the UK, son of a former Cavalry Officer who served in First Polish Armoured Division but who could not return home after the war and died in 1971, when Michael was only seven.

Michael some years later chanced upon some documents in his attic that revealed his father's contribution to hitherto unknown aspects of Poland's contributions to the allied war effort: From helping the embarkation of 16,000 Polish troops after the Fall of France, to saving the lives of some Jewish soldiers. From being sent on a secret mission to Ireland by Churchill, to persuading General Maczek to keep fighting after the news of the Yalta Agreement in 1945. Michael has been awarded UK CEO of the Year four times, but the award he is most proud of is his Order of Merit from the Knights of Malta for his work on behalf of Polish veterans, which included securing an apology from the Prime Minister in 2003 for the lack of Polish participation in the 1946 Victory Parade and lobbying the organisers of the 60th anniversary parade to put the Polish veterans at the front of the Parade to make up for 60 years of hurt.

The British officers who ran the Polish Section of SOE were among the best friends the Poles had during the Second World War. If ultimately, they failed in helping Poland regain its freedom and independence in 1945, it was not for want of trying. Anthony Massey is a retired journalist with BBC News. In a career lasting 33 years producing daily news on TV and radio, he spent much of his time covering wars and disasters round the world. This experience gave particular poignancy to his many conversations with his father Lewis, who, along with Anthony's grandparents, had escaped from Poland to Britain as a refugee in 1940. 
4. A Little Poland in Wales - The story of three former Polish military hospitals in Penley and Iscoyd Park (1941–2004)

Stanisław Bereza grew up in the Penley Hospital Community and is the son of Col. Dr Michał Bereza. He studied at the London School of Economics and then worked as an economist and risk manager at Barclays Bank. In 1989 he participated in UK government training for the post-communist government of Poland. This was followed by a secondment to the Polish Ministry of Finance to work as an adviser to the Finance Minister Leszek Balcerowicz and later as the Inspector of Banks at the Central Bank of Poland. After working for the World Bank on development projects in Latvia, Estonia and other countries he joined the Banking Supervision Department of the Bank of England. Subsequently he held senior appointments at the Bank and the Financial Services Authority including Head of the Traded Risk Department. Between 2008 and 2011 he was the Inspector of Banks at the Central Bank of the Bahamas.

In 1992 he wrote *Zarządzanie ryzykiem bankowym* (Bank Risk Management) – the first publication of the newly formed Polish Institute of Bankers.




5. Rhineland Hitler's last defence 1944-45

Leica parachuted to F2 on 7th July 1944

The Polish-run intelligence network known as "F2" had the fighting spirit of an insurrection and the discipline of a military operation. It was a matrix of collaboration between Frenchmen and Poles and between amateurs and intelligence professionals. Over time the relative number of Poles declined but a small Polish team, reporting to Polish Intelligence in London, was always in the driver's seat. The lecture will explore how agents with different backgrounds (French and Polish, amateur and professional) made F2 one of the largest, most enduring and most effective of the allied intelligence networks in wartime France.

The lecture will be delivered by Franciszek Rozwadowski. An economist by profession, he has been working on F2 for a number of years. His interest began with a family connection – his father was "Pascal", F2's chief of intelligence during 1943-44. His research focuses on the network's structure and working methods. He has also studied German counterintelligence in France, especially the Wehrmacht Cipher Department's (OKW/Chi's) attack on F2's encrypted radio traffic.




8. 1941 Sikorski-Maisky pact

Jennifer Grant is a Postgraduate Researcher at Queen Mary University of London. Having studied Modern History at Oxford, she undertook an MA at the School of Slavonic and East European Studies. Her current research focuses on alliance-building and the challenges of honouring the Anglo-Polish Alliance both in wartime Britain and in the post-war world.

The granddaughter of Poles deported to Siberia, Jennifer is keen to build bridges between the Polish and British understanding of the war. As well as appearing at history festivals, she has recently edited the first English translation of the memoirs of General Maczek: 'The Price of Victory: The Memoir of the Commander of the 1st Polish Armoured Division'.


